DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES (DSS)

Disability Support Services provides reasonable accommodations and services for qualified students with documented disabilities.

What is a disability? What does DSS do?

The Americans with Disabilities Act, 1990, defines a disability as a “mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities.” Walking, eating, talking, breathing, writing, listening, and learning are examples of major life activities. If you have a documented impairment, you may be entitled to certain accommodations under the ADA.

What are “reasonable accommodations and services”?

Reasonable accommodations and services may include priority registration, extra time on tests, special seating arrangements, assistance with class notes, and/or alternate format materials, such as tape recorders, large print, or other adaptive technology, which meet the individual needs of the person with the disability.

Admission and Financial Aid Tips

- Starting early is key! This ensures that all paperwork and financial aid are in place in time for registration.
- Complete an Application for Admission and return it to any Student Affairs location.
- Provide appropriate identification documents to validate your citizenship.
- Request transcripts/GED scores from all previous schools attended.
- Ensure that the Admissions and Financial Aid offices have your most current mailing address.
- Check your College e-mail regularly for important announcements.
- Sign and return this Admission Agreement, indicating admission status, promptly and provide any other requested documents.
- File early for financial aid! You may apply for federal assistance online by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The College financial aid code is **001018**.
- Check the College Web site at www.wallace.edu for scholarship information.
- Respond promptly to all correspondence from the Financial Aid Office. Do not wait until registration to finalize your financial aid. It should be complete before you register for classes.
- Take your placement exam prior to registration.
- Attend scheduled Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR) session, meet with your advisor, and register for classes.
- Pay tuition by appropriate deadlines.

Placement and Challenge Exam Procedures

According to Alabama State Board of Education Policy 802.1, students may challenge their English, math, and/or reading ASSET®/COMPASS™ placement scores by retesting one time only if first scores are unsatisfactory. A fee of \$8 is charged to retake COMPASS™.

A CIS 146 challenge exam is also available. Students interested can contact Mr. David Cruz-Wells at 334-556-2255, 1-800-543-2426 (Ext. 2255), or e-mail dcruzwells@wallace.edu. No more than 10 applicants per test are allowed for this challenge exam. Students should arrive for tests promptly. No one will be tested after 15 minutes into the test. Contact Mr. Cruz-Wells 24 hours prior to testing to allow time for scheduling and resource allocation.

The Alabama Community College System Biology Placement Exam is available for students who desire to exempt BIO 103, which is the prerequisite for BIO 201—Anatomy and Physiology I and BIO 220—General Microbiology. A fee of \$26.25 is required prior to biology placement testing, and a student may not retest. Payment forms for all tests are available on the Wallace Campus in Grimsley Hall, Rooms 116, 119, and 120 and on the Sparks Campus in the Front Office of Building A.

Payment forms must be processed in the Business Office or appropriate designated office on each campus. Students must bring a receipt and their federal or state photo identification to the Test Center. For Test Center hours, contact the Wallace Campus at 334-983-3521 (Ext. 2208, 2281, and 2294) or the Sparks Campus at 334-687-3543 (Ext. 4210).

Technology-Based Instruction

Information About Online and Hybrid Classes

Wallace Community College uses Blackboard to support its online instructional programs. This technology provides students with an opportunity to pursue courses in formats that meet all course requirements while reducing in-class time. Faculty members are able to post course syllabi, contact information, and course content and ensure that students are aware of online activities that require participation, such as communicating with the instructor and other students, completing online assignments and quizzes, and posting course grades. Students must be aware of the requirements for each course in which they are enrolled.

Online and Hybrid Courses with On-Campus Labs

The Internet is used to deliver instruction in the following courses:

- Online courses are delivered over the Internet using Blackboard. These courses will require the student's physical presence on-campus to complete selected exams.
- Hybrid courses with on-campus meetings meet online for a portion of the course meetings. Students are required to attend scheduled on-campus sessions at the designated campus.
- Online and hybrid courses require use of the Blackboard system. Students can access the Blackboard system at courses.wallace.edu.

Requirements and Assistance for Online and Hybrid Courses

Wallace Community College offers many classes that reduce the amount of time students must physically be on campus. These online and hybrid classes are indicated by “N” or “H” in the section number. While online classes do not require weekly meetings, they do require students to complete mid-term and final exams on campus under the direct supervision of the instructor. Hybrid classes require students to attend weekly on-campus meetings throughout the semester. Wallace Community College does not offer classes that are entirely online.

Students interested in taking online or hybrid classes should carefully consider their learning styles. These classes require students to be self-motivated and able to complete assignments with minimal supervision. Students should also possess strong computer skills. The eLearning training will help ensure that students are ready for online courses. The eLearning training is highly recommended for all students, even those not taking online courses.

Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR)	New student advising and preregistration sessions will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel via letter of invitation.
Placement Testing	Placement tests are required for all new students unless they meet exemption criteria as stated in the College catalog. Placement tests will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel by letter of invitation. Prior to the scheduled test date, the student must complete an Application for Admission. Students must bring a valid driver license or state-issued identification card to the testing session and may also bring a calculator. Students who desire to improve placement scores may contact the Counseling Office at 334-556-2294. An \$8 fee will be charged for retesting.
Tuition Payment	Tuition and fees are calculated on completion of advising and preregistration. Students have the option of paying tuition and fees anytime before 4:00 p.m., August 15 . Students who preregister but fail to pay tuition and fees by the noted deadline will be removed from the computer and are at risk of losing their class selections. If you are dropped for nonpayment, you must reregister August 18-19 or during late registration, August 22-23 . A fee of \$25 is required for late registration, August 22-23 . All students, including those with scholarships and financial aid, must clear Business Office procedures to complete registration.





CERTIFIED DIETARY MANAGER

Become a trained food service manager who supervises kitchen operation services in long-term care facilities, hospitals, schools, correctional institutions, and other noncommercial food service settings. Tuition and fees are \$1,995. A minimum of five students is required. WIA approved.

CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)

An ongoing need exists for certified nurse assistants in the region. This 20-day course prepares students for the state board exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Tuition and fees are \$695. A minimum of seven students is required. WIA approved.

COMPUTER SKILLS FOR TODAY'S WORKPLACE

This six-week program will help students develop computer skills to work in an office environment. Skills range from basic use and keyboarding to proficiency in Microsoft® Excel®, PowerPoint®, and Word®. A minimum of four students is required. WIA approved.

PREAPPRENTICE ELECTRICAL LINEWORKER TRAINING

Develop skills to work in the electrical distribution industry by becoming a lineworker. This seven-week course will prepare you in pole climbing, CDL training, electrical theory, line make-ups, interpersonal skills, interview techniques, and much more. A minimum of eight students is required. WIA approved.

OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT

Develop your skills to assist an ophthalmologist or an optometrist in an eye-care facility. This 14-week training course could be the starting point for your new career in the health care field. Tuition, fees, and textbook costs are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. WIA approved.

PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CODING

This 80-hour course prepares students to take the AAPC coding exam. Classes meet on Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Course fees include tuition, all text and reference books, AAPC student membership, and exam. Tuition and fees are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. WIA approved.

PLUMBERS APPRENTICE COURSE

Develop your plumbing skills for entry into the plumbing field through this eight-month short course. The certified curriculum will be delivered in three modules in conjunction with the State of Alabama Plumbing and Gas Fitters Board. Learn plastic, copper, cast-iron, carbon, stainless, and carbon steel piping and fittings as well as fixtures, faucets, water distribution systems, and plumbing codes used in the plumbing profession. Tuition is \$500 per module or \$1,500 for all modules. A minimum of eight students is required. WIA approved.

READY TO WORK (RTW)

Ready To Work is an 8-week, employer-designed course that provides trainees with entry-level skills required for employment with most industries and businesses in Alabama. The training focuses on basic education (applied math, reading and locating information, and communication skills), computer skills (Microsoft® Excel®, Windows 7®, and Word®), problem-solving, workplace behavior, manufacturing (precision measurement, safety), and job acquisition skills. A minimum of four students is required. This course is free to the public.



WCC Goes Tobacco Free

Wallace Community College is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for its employees, students, and visitors. The College recognizes the right of persons to make their own decisions about their personal use of tobacco products away from the College. However, in light of findings of the U.S. Surgeon General that exposure to secondhand tobacco smoke and use of tobacco products are significant health hazards, it is the intent of the College to establish a tobacco-free environment on its campuses and in its vehicles. Consequently, the use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products, including the carrying of any lighted smoking instrument, in College buildings or in or upon other College premises or inside College-owned, rented, or leased vehicles, is prohibited. Wallace Community College employees, students, and visitors are not permitted to use tobacco products inside their private vehicles while on College property.



For the purposes of this policy, a *tobacco product* is defined to include any lighted or unlighted cigarette, cigar, pipe, bidi, clove cigarette, and any other smoking product, as well as smokeless or spit tobacco, also known as dip, chew, snuff, or snus, in any form.

All College employees, students, visitors, and contractors are required to comply with this policy, which shall remain in force at all times. Any College employee or student found to be in violation of the tobacco-free policy will be subject to a monetary fine. Tickets will be issued by College Police officers for violations of the College tobacco-free policy. Monetary fines will be imposed as listed below, depending on whether the offender is an employee or student.

Any visitor or contractor found to be violating the policy shall be asked to discontinue the disallowed activity, and any failure by a visitor or contractor to discontinue the disallowed activity after being requested to do so shall result in the visitor or contractor being escorted off the College premises by the College Police.

STUDENT FINES

Any Wallace student found to have violated this policy shall be subject to the following fines:

- First student ticket – Warning
- Second student ticket – \$25.00 fine

All fines must be paid within 7 days of ticketing. Fines that are not paid within the 7 days shall automatically double in amount. A student who has a pending fine or fines may not register for classes nor have transcripts released until all fines are paid in full. Any student desiring to appeal a fine arising from the finding of a tobacco-free violation under this policy may do so with the appropriate Campus Dean.

EMPLOYEE FINES

Any Wallace employee found to have violated this policy shall be subject to the following fines:

- First employee ticket – Warning
- Second employee ticket – \$25.00 fine

All fines must be paid within 7 days of ticketing. Fines that are not paid within the 7 days shall automatically double in amount. Any employee desiring to appeal a fine arising from the finding of a tobacco-free violation under this policy may do so with the appropriate Campus Dean.

With the exception of advertising in a newspaper, magazine, or similar publication that is not produced by Wallace Community College, no tobacco-related advertising or sponsorship shall be permitted on the College's campuses or at College-sponsored events. No tobacco-related advertising or sponsorship shall appear in any publications produced by the College or by any club or association authorized by Wallace Community College. For the purposes of this policy, the term *tobacco-related* applies to the use of a tobacco brand or corporate name, trademark, logo, symbol or motto, selling message, recognizable pattern of colors or any other indicia of product identification identical to, similar to, or identifiable with, those used for any brand of tobacco products or company that manufactures tobacco products.

All regularly scheduled classes will end at 12:15 p.m. on Friday, December 9. Final exams for all other classes will be given in the appropriate time blocks as shown below. "Open" or "Proctored" exam periods may be used for makeup exams, proctored hybrid, or online course exams. The ENG101 exit exams are Monday, December 12, 8:00 – 10:00 a.m. or 10:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.

The table below outlines the exam dates and times for courses that follow the standard scheduling scheme. Sometimes day and time combinations do not exactly fit within this scheme. Faculty members in technical, nursing, and allied health programs whose courses combine theory, lab, and clinical meetings should use the theory meeting time to schedule their final exams. Those whose courses do not follow the standard scheduling scheme will determine test dates and times within the testing period that best complement the standard schedule. Faculty members teaching distance education classes and those who offer traditional course final exams via Wallace Online will make arrangements for computer labs for their exams.

NEW STUDENT ID POLICY

To enhance the safety and security of all personnel on the campuses of Wallace Community College, ALL students are required to obtain a photo identification card. This student ID will serve as the official means of identification for Wallace Community College.

Unless a student loses or misplaces an ID card, it will only need to be issued once. The first issued student ID is **FREE**. **All replacements will cost \$10**. Receipts from the Wallace Community College Business Office must be provided before being issued a replacement ID.



Students are required to wear student ID on their person at all times while on campus. Individuals not wearing proper identification will be asked what business they have on campus. If the answer is satisfactory (i.e., potential applicant filing for admission or financial aid, visitors on campus tour), individuals will be allowed to continue with their business and immediately leave campus upon completion of that business. If individuals claim to be students, College officials will ask for their student ID. If none can be provided, the individuals will be asked to leave the campus until they can return with a valid Wallace Community College student ID. Those who resist will be escorted off campus by College Police, and further disciplinary action may be taken if necessary.

This initiative will provide a high quality, single-card system that allows efficient access to all card-related services throughout the College. This will also enable the College to seek new and expanded uses of the card through improved and advanced technology.

Students will be required to obtain a student ID card before attendance verification, as faculty members will not allow a student to attend class without an ID past this date. Dates and times of ID drives will correspond with this time frame and will be announced at the beginning of each term. The student ID will also be used for discounts at local businesses on specified days (discount specifics are found on the back of the student ID card).

Students will be required to present proper government-issued photo identification before an ID card is issued. For ID pictures, Wallace Community College requires individuals to remove any items not worn as part of their daily appearance (i.e., prescription eyeglasses). The only exceptions are items worn for cultural or religious purposes. All bandannas, hats, sunglasses, visors, etc. are to be removed before the picture is taken.
