Spring Facts 2021



Summary

Wallace Community College – Dothan (WCCD) enrolled 3,533 students in Spring 2021. The majority of students enrolled were female (68%), White (61%), and enrolled part-time (66%). The majority of students resided in Houston county (40%).

Programs with the highest enrollment included General Studies, Associate Degree Nursing, and Practical Nursing. In Spring 2021, there were 894 course sections offered totaling 30,513 credit hours.

1,567 students received Pell in Spring 2021 totaling \$3,188,636.00 with the average aid being \$2,034.87. The majority of students receiving Pell were female (79%), White (48%), and part-time (55%).

In Spring 2021 WCCD employed 128 full-time faculty with a cumulative credit hour production of 27,918 and 32 part-time with a cumulative credit hour production of 2,595.


