

# Fall Facts 2024



### Summary

Wallace Community College – Dothan (WCCD) enrolled 4,045 students in Fall 2024. The majority of students enrolled were female (68%), White (56%), and/or enrolled part-time (71%). The majority of students resided in Houston county (39%).

Programs with the highest enrollment included General Studies, Associate Degree Nursing, and Cosmetology. In Fall 2024, there were 840 course sections offered totaling 33,296 credit hours.

1,939 students received Pell in Fall 2024 totaling \$4,840,380.24 with the average aid being \$2,496.33. The majority of students receiving Pell were female (77%), White (47%), and/or part-time (59%).

In Fall 2024 WCCD employed 120 full-time faculty with a cumulative credit hour production of 29,786 and 39 part-time with a cumulative credit hour production of 3,510.









# **Enrollment By Major**




